Since 1989, **Stanley Bergman** has been Chairman of the Board & CEO of Henry Schein, Inc., a Fortune 500 company headquartered in Melville, NY, and the world's largest provider of health care products and services to office-based dental, animal health and medical practitioners. Henry Schein is ranked #1 in its industry on Fortune's 2016 World's Most Admired Companies List. Social responsibility is a hallmark of the company's charter. "Team Schein" works actively to increase access to health care among underserved populations and to foster grassroots health care and sustainable entrepreneurial economic development initiatives in the United States, Africa and other developing regions of the world.

Eddie Bergman is President of IDS, a consulting firm focusing on tourism marketing and development as well as real estate management services in New York. Eddie is also Co-CEO of E&E Hospitality Group, which owns and manages two NYC restaurants: E&E Grill House (Times Square) and Hill and Bay (Murray Hill / Kips Bay). In 1999 at the age of 19, Eddie co-founded and currently serves as President of the Board of MCW (Miracle Corners of the World), an NGO devoted to empowering youth to make positive change in their communities, with a special focus on Africa. Eddie was appointed a Goodwill Ambassador for NEPAD, the economic development program of the African Union in recognition of his service as Executive Director of the Africa Travel Association, a position he held for nearly a decade. He has received several humanitarian awards for his work, including the 2009 Ellis Island Medal of Honor.
