**Dan Zahavi** is Professor of Philosophy at University of Copenhagen and University of Oxford, and director of the Center for Subjectivity Research in Copenhagen. His most important publications include *Self-awareness and Alterity* (1999), *Husserl's Phenomenology* (2003), *Subjectivity and Selfhood* (2005), *The Phenomenological Mind* (together with Shaun Gallagher) (2008/2012), *Self and Other* (2014), *Husserl's Legacy* (2017), and *Phenomenology: The Basics* (2019). Zahavi also serves as the co-editor in chief of the journal *Phenomenology and the cognitive sciences*.

**Abstract:** What is we-identity? How should we understand collective intentionality? In my talk, I will discuss what I take to be some of the cognitive and affective preconditions for we-intentionality. I will compare and contrast current proposals with ideas found in classical phenomenology, and argue that the first person plural might depend on the second person singular.
